

Horseback riding fulfills every definition of sport and is one of the oldest sports. Yet people think it is easy and doesn't require a lot of skill to ride. Often the only time people see horseback riding on TV, and those riders are professional riders and their skills are so good that they make it look effortless. Or the only horse they have rode is a ranch horse, where the only thing those horses do is walk and don't act up.
